

DOGS AT ALLADALE WILDERNESS RESERVE

We love to welcome dogs at Alladale, we know that they are part of the family and want to enjoy your holiday by your side. For the safety and comfort of our staff and other guests and to protect the wildlife at the reserve we do require dog owners to abide by the following rules.

DOG FRIENDLY AREAS

In Alladale lodge our dog friendly areas are the front porch, the main hallway and the upstairs landing. Dogs are not permitted in the staff areas, drawing room or bedrooms, this is to protect any guests or staff with dog allergies.

Eagles Crag and Ghillies rest are both fully dog friendly areas, however we request that the dogs stay on the floor rather than on bed or other furniture.

HOUSEKEEPING SURCHARGE

There is an additional housekeeping fee in our accommodation to cover our additional cleaning requirements:

- Eagles Crag & Ghillies rest: £50 per dog
- Alladale lodge: £200 per dog

PICK IT UP

The reserve is enjoyed by many people and wildlife, including young children who play in the grassy and bushy areas. To keep everyone safe please pick up after your dog (even if no one is watching).

We can provide dog poo bags if needed.

DOGS ON THE RESERVE

In order to protect ground nesting birds and other wildlife we request that you keep your dogs on a lead if you are visiting the reserve between April and June as this is prime nesting time for our birdlife.

Dogs are welcome on our 4x4 safaris and other Activities, they may be joined by our reserve dog Baxter who is very friendly with people and dogs.

For the safety of your dog please keep them at a distance from our highland cows and any other livestock in the area.

DOG BEHAVIOUR

We expect all dogs to be well behaved and toilet trained. Any damage or extensive mess will be chargeable to the owner.

Well trained dogs will be given complimentary cuddles by our staff and the occasional scrap of bacon from the kitchen.
